IT Design Thinking Robotics

Students of Grade 11 were assigned topics on Boolean Logic and Problem Solving. They prepared thoroughly and presented their understanding to the class based on their research and preparations.

Students in Grade 4, 5 and 8 are introduced to the basics of robotics and coding with Humanoid, Mecanum wheels and Quadraped respectively. They learn to recognize its components, understand simple block-based programming, and practice controlling the robot to move forward, backward, and make turns.




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Art


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Textile Design - Stain Removal

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

MATH @ a Glance


