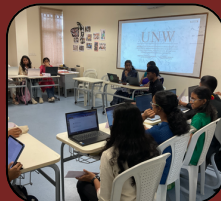
## BVS-MUN

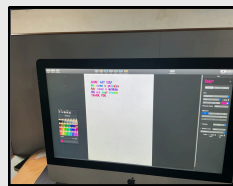
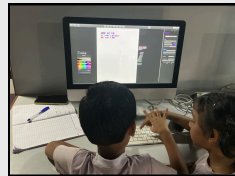
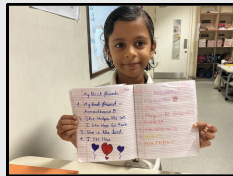
Students of Grade 6 explored various embroidery stitches and created beautiful designs on fabric.

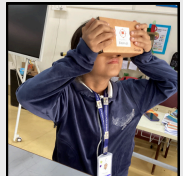
